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***QUESTIONS TO ASK***  
**About Infertility Treatment from**  
**Alternative Treatment Practitioners (#12)**

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If you are considering using an alternative therapy, such as acupuncture, chiropractic, herbs or naturopathic physicians, to supplement your infertility treatment, choose a practitioner with the same methods you use to select a physician. Try to find someone with experience in treating your specific infertility problem and ask about success rates. Ask for personal references and conduct interviews with several practitioners to find a person with whom you feel comfortable. Questions to consider include:

1. Ask how many infertility patients the practitioner has treated in the past three months and what the success rate has been for individual diagnoses.
2. Ask where the practitioner received their training or degree.
3. Ask how many visits will be needed to address your infertility issues and inquire about the cost.
4. Ask what the fees are for various services.
5. Ask for a treatment plan and explanation of what points, adjustments, and/or herbs will be used and why. Ask which type of infertility problems they have had the most success treating.
6. Is the practitioner willing to work with your medical infertility specialist?
7. Tell the practitioner if you are currently taking any medications and ask if these will conflict with treatment or if you should expect the medications to affect you differently during or after you complete a treatment.
8. Ask if treatment at mid-cycle or after could jeopardize an early, undiagnosed pregnancy.
9. If receiving acupuncture treatment, be certain that disposable needles are used.
10. If you are considering the use of herbs, ask about proper storage and preparation and whether or not preparations should be taken on an empty stomach or after eating.

11. Inform your infertility physician if you are using an alternative treatment to make sure that there will be no unusual drug interactions.
12. Are references available from current or former infertility patients?
